Clery Crimes and Reporting Obligations

The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (The Clery Act)

The Clery Act is a federal law requiring all institutions of higher education who receive federal funding to disclose information about **crime on their campuses** and in the surrounding communities. As an institution that receives federal funding, UConn must comply with the Clery Act.

Key Information



Location

The Clery Act is driven by **location** of where a crime was committed, with a focus on university owned or leased property. This means, **crimes** that occur on any of UConn's campuses, and on any public property that is within any of UConn's campuses, should be reported to the Division of University Safety.

Requirement by Law

The Clery Act is enforced by the **U.S. Department of Education**. Failure to comply with the Clery Act could impact or jeopardize campus safety as well as result in large fines levied against UConn. It could also result in the suspension or total loss of federal funding granted to UConn.

Annual Security Report

In compliance with the Clery Act, the Division of University Safety publishes an Annual Security and Fire Safety Report. The report contains institutional **policies on campus safety and security**, policies concerning alcohol and drug use, crime prevention, the reporting of crimes, and the reporting and investigation of sexual assault and other matters. Additionally, the report includes statistics on **crime** and reported **fires** in on-campus housing.

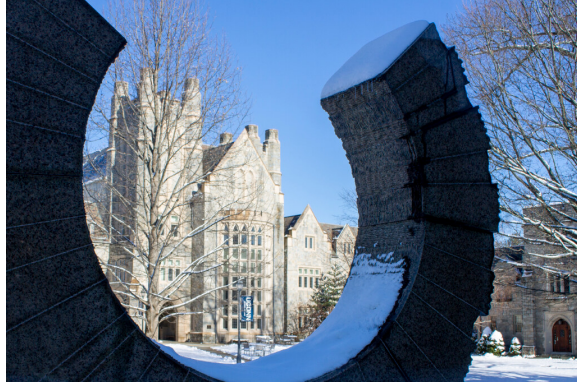

Timely Warnings

The Clery Act requires UConn to issue timely warnings and campus alerts for **Clery crimes** that represent an **ongoing threat** to the safety of students or employees, or emergency notifications upon confirmation of a significant emergency or dangerous situation. UConnALERT is the official emergency alerting system for all UConn campuses and property. Click on the link below to confirm that you are enrolled in UConnALERT and receive timely warnings.

Reporting Requirements

The Clery Act designates many individuals throughout the university as Campus Security Authority's (CSA). These are individuals who are likely to receive reports of criminal violations on campus, and are **obligated** to file a **CSA Report** with the Division of University Safety. You will be notified by the Division of University Safety if you are designated as a CSA at UConn.

Emergency Reporting

The CSA Report Form is intended to provide CSA's with a method of reporting Clery crimes to the Division of University Safety for inclusion in the University's annual compilation of Clery statistics. The CSA Report Form is **NOT** a method of notifying police of an emergency, dangerous situation, or other hazard. In the event of an **emergency** situation please call **9-1-1**.
